**Summary:** The Poverty Simulation provides participants with the opportunity to assume the role of a low-income family member living on a limited budget. The experience is divided into four 15-minute sessions, each of which represents one week in which you must provide for your family and maintain your home. As one participant commented, "This poverty simulation dramatically demonstrates how much time and energy many families have to give just to survive from day to day. It quickly dispels the myth "that people would do fine if they would only go out and get a job!"

**Learning Objectives:**

This program is designed to teach core inter-professional competencies<sup>1</sup> that are necessary for collaborative practice. The skills learned are useful to understanding the need for practicing shared problem solving with face-to-face interaction in the clinic setting.

1. Place interests of patients and populations at center of interprofessional health care delivery and population health programs and policies, with the goal of promoting health and health equity across the life span. (IPEC competency: VE1<sup>1</sup>)
2. Work in cooperation with those who receive care, those who provide care, and others who contribute to or support the delivery of prevention and health services and programs. (IPEC competency: VE5<sup>1</sup>)
3. Forge interdependent relationships with other professions within and outside of the health system to improve care and advance learning. (IPEC competency: RR7<sup>1</sup>)
